

GIFTS OF THE DESERT

Sedona Photography Intensive : November 1-4, 2007

Come join us for a photography seminar exploring one of the most stunning landscapes in the Southwest. We will be based in Sedona, Arizona, a land of red rocks, canyons, vistas, forests and mountains. North central Arizona is a diverse land, rich in history and prehistory, stretching from desert and red rock canyons to the volcanic alpine peaks of the San Francisco Mountains, sacred to all the Native peoples of northern Arizona.

This intensive seminar will include an autumn hiking exploration of sites around Sedona, portfolio reviews, and guidance on how to capture the moments of the day and place by understanding composition and lighting techniques. Evenings will include feedback on the photos from the day and interactive discussions with group members about the focus and direction they would like to take in their photography.

Digital cameras are suggested so that immediate feedback can be shared in the evenings.

There are hundreds of trails winding through this rich land. Our days will include visits to ancient Native American sites, deep canyons, rivers, and special spots of rugged beauty. Please bring appropriate footwear for some light to moderate hiking.



The Leaders:



Charles (Chuck) Feil is a well known aerial landscape photographer who has eleven books published and is currently curator of photography at Pan Terra Gallery (a well regarded photography gallery in Bisbee, Arizona). Chuck will be leading an interactive workshop to unravel the mysteries of making dynamic photographs that will be saleable in galleries and to commercial buyers of photography.



Philip Snyder, PhD is a Sedona resident and guide with a background in the "anthropology of place". He has loved and roamed this landscape for years, and will lead us into special out of the way places. Philip will provide geological, ecological and cultural context, and offer various walking meditation practices that can be employed to deepen awareness and connection with one's surroundings.

All levels welcome, but a working knowledge of digital photography is required.

The workshop will be limited to ten participants. Early registration is highly recommended!

Cost: \$575. \$100.00 deposit to hold a space (only six remaining) Balance due on September 1, 2007. Includes double occupancy at Sky Ranch Lodge, all meals (except drinks) transportation in Sedona, park admissions, and two lively informative guys!
